

Announcing Clinical Psychology Term, Winter 2010

What is Clinical Psychology Term? Those interested in the areas of clinical psychology, counseling psychology, or social work can spend a term immersing themselves in these fields by taking two courses – PSYC 300A/277 (Clinical and Abnormal Psychology) and PSYC 300B/279 (Theories and Methods of Psychotherapy) – while simultaneously completing an internship in the Galesburg area that is related to clinical psychology (PSYC 300C). Students in the program gain an increased knowledge of clinical psychology through the integration of academic information and assignments in the two classes with the hands-on experience of working in settings typical of clinical psychologists, counselors and social workers.

How does Clinical Psychology Term work? During Winter term, students take three courses, including an internship course – PSYC 300A, 300B, and 300C. Students are assigned to internships based on the best match between their interests and site availability. Past internship experiences have included work with families and children experiencing a variety of difficulties in adjustment, individuals who are chronically mentally ill, terminally ill, or developmentally disabled, and women and children who are the victims of domestic abuse. The internship can be taken for either .5 or 1 credit, the main difference being in terms of the number of hours per week the student spends at the internship site.

Who is eligible for Clinical Psychology Term? Prerequisites for Clinical Term are two 200 level PSYC courses, sophomore standing and permission of the Psychology Department via an application process (see below). Students who have previously completed PSYC 277 or PSYC 279 are NOT eligible for Clinical Term. You do not have to be a psychology major to be eligible; students from psychology, anthropology/sociology, Social Service or other areas are welcome to apply.

How do I enroll in Clinical Psychology Term? First, check to make sure you have the prerequisites (see above). Then, complete an application and turn it in to Professor Gail Ferguson by Friday October 16, 2009 at 4pm. She and Professor Tim Kasser will review the applications and let students know by Friday, October 23 whether or not they may enroll in Clinical Psychology Term.
