

## Assistant Professor, Comparative Politics

The Department of Political Science and International Relations at Knox College invites applications for a full time, tenure track assistant professor in comparative politics beginning September 1, 2018.

We seek an energetic and creative scholar who adopts innovative approaches to teaching and research in a residential, liberal arts setting. Candidates should be prepared to teach introductory and advanced courses in comparative politics with a primary focus on an area other than Latin America. Ability to teach in more than one area is highly desirable. Knox College offers three academic terms per year, with a teaching load of two courses per term. Knox is particularly interested in qualified candidates who can contribute to the diversity and inclusivity of our academic community through their research, teaching, and service. Qualifications: Ph.D. in Political Science, International Relations, or a closely related field expected at time of appointment; exceptional ABD candidates considered.

Interested applicants should submit:

1. Cover letter addressing undergraduate liberal arts teaching philosophy and research agenda,
2. Curriculum Vitae,
3. Three letters of reference, with at least one addressing teaching potential,
4. Teaching evaluations and any other evidence of teaching excellence,
5. Unofficial graduate transcripts,
6. An example of recent scholarship such as an article, book chapter, or conference paper.
