## 10:00 a.m. Welcome and Approval of Fall Minutes

## 10:15 a.m. Discussion and Vote: Mission Statement and Bylaw Changes

Marty Glickman, Ad-Hoc Bylaws Committee, Sarah Byrd, All

- Change to individual award committees combined into one award committee, alumni trustee committee was dissolved.
- Mission statement was added to the bylaws
- Constitution had been separated in the past from the bylaws, it was found and has been attached back to the bylaws.
  - This cleared up the question of whether the bylaws are for the Council or the Association. The Constitution clarifies this.
- Executive committee
  - Currently the chair, vice chair, secretary, immediate past chair. Revision adds the standing committee chairs to the executive committee, in order to make sure there are more voices on the executive committee, especially for the purpose nominating new members
- Added electronic meeting rules allows us to include international alumni representatives
- There have been some questions about Knox Clubs: details such as the size of clubs, structure, who can be members. It has been suggested that we discuss this in the fall to further explore.

## 10:45 a.m. College Update and Q&A

- This is a very challenging and perilous time for higher education. The unprecedented nature of the situation requires planning for as many scenarios as possible. The staff are working on narrowing those scenarios for the fall. The virus will set the timeframe.
  - Anticipating 10-25% declines in domestic enrollment with larger for international students.
    - International students are subject to changing immigration laws. International students International students are 20% of Knox enrollment currently. Students of color and 1<sup>st</sup> generation students will also be greatly affected by economic factors. Families may be more reticent to send students away from home at this time.
    - Working on flexible calendar models for the fall. Including late start, no start until winter (run through August), start with small group on campus in fall (first year or athletes), block models (Cornell and Colorado College already do this), gap years with ways to earn credit during the time.
    - Some attempts to mitigate other risks have become weaknesses now: greater number of international students as well as recruitment of students outside the midwest due to declining regional numbers.
    - Looking for ways to increase transfers too.
  - Students are generally not in a high-risk group, but we do have faculty and staff who do. Trying to strike a balance to have a safe number of students on campus which also provide financial support to the college
    - Task forces have been put together to deal with these issues public health, Education, financial
  - Likely a two or three year challenge
- Alumni support is a key strength most important thing that the AC can do is to pivot to rallying support from fellow alumni for the college. Make sure that people understand that our historic strengths of the institution, small class sizes/ratios, student groups, etc, are going to make the present moment difficult, but that alumni support is key to carrying the school through this period.
- Questions:
  - Financial impacts so far
    - Stock market is not the biggest threat. Room and board and enrollment are. Sending students home in the spring was a \$3 million cost. If students don't return in the fall, that will be \$9 million cost. No international students will be a further hit. Annual fund is key here. COVID-19 fund will be helpful too, but unrestricted funds may be more so.
    - Many college are looking at revenue shortfalls of 25%. Have received 2/3 of MAP allotment, but the State is facing a large shortfall too.
  - Specific actions AC can take
    - Because this problem is larger than just Knox. Higher ed is going to require more stimulus support. Advocacy for higher ed is key. (Knox has applied for all grants for which it is eligible.)
  - Feedback from students on willingness to participate in remote learning in the fall
    - Monday will launch a survey with scenarios. Waited to allow them to experience distance learning.
    - Anticipate resistance to paying full tuition for online instruction
    - Knox will be partnering in the summer with other ACA institutions
  - International students on campus
    - 150 students are still on campus, but about 50 of them are seniors and will graduate. We may retain some of the others.
  - Before the pandemic, were there any measurable increases with new majors and minors
    - Yes there were, especially with business. Hoping to launch a few more in the fall.

- There has been some talk in the past of low-residency masters programs. There was some
  reticence from faculty, but there may be more openness to this now.
- Alumni engagement and loyalty is going to be the driving force of success. Most pressing needs are financial and public policy advocacy (especially if you know someone). Higher ed are anchor institutions in their communities and students will be part of future solutions.
