The successful candidate will be expected to teach a range of courses in molecular and/or organismal biology. This may include introductory courses as well as upper level courses that fit the candidate's area of expertise and the needs of the department. A Ph.D. at the time of appointment is preferred but exceptional ABD candidates will be considered.
