ENG 280A Virginia Woolf may be a household name today, but that was not always the case. It took the rise of feminist literary studies in the 1970s, and the establishment of modernist studies as a discrete field in the 1990s to canonize Woolf as a major English novelist and critic of the twentieth century. In this single-author course, we will examine Woolf's intertwined thinking of gender, sexuality, and politics - in particular, the politics of fascism. Via readings of Woolf's two political tracts (A Room of One's Own and Three Guineas), four of her novels (Jacob's Room; The Waves; The Years; and Between the Acts), as well as some of her short essays and stories, we will ask ourselves how questions about political power informed Woolf's ideas about sex and gender, as well as her highly influential and experimental approach to modern fiction.

Of special consideration is the figure of the child in Sendak's work, its origins as well as its monstrous and angelic incarnations.
