ADMISSION AMBASSADOR

Admission Ambassadors are the 'Face of Knox' and serve as representatives of Knox College to prospective students, their families, and other campus visitors. Interactions with current students have a huge impact on college decision making, which means you have a huge impact on everyone that comes through our doors. Tours of campus can be physically demanding, so you must be able to walk and talk for an hour. You'll be interacting with prospective students in a variety of in-person and virtual avenues. Strong communication and interpersonal skills are a must! If you're excited about sharing your college experience and have a passion for changing lives, apply for the "happiest job on campus!"

Responsibilities:

- Ambassador role will begin during the spring term with training, tour shadowing, and assistance with recruitment activities. Additional training will take place just before the start of new student orientation in the fall.
- New ambassadors must also successfully complete IDIS 130: Introduction to Leadership course (.5 credit) during the spring term.
- Attend monthly admission ambassador meetings, starting spring term.
- Greet prospective students and other visitors and provide exceptional hospitality as you cover the reception desk. Ensure each visitor has a memorable experience.
- Engage prospective students and families on a personal level during information sessions and campus tours, in the Welcome Center, on the phone, via email or social media, and other recruitment campaigns. Provide reviews of Knox and represent Knox on third-party websites.
- Convey stories of the Knox experience and the value of a Knox education with responsible honesty.
