

The Knox College Basketball Camp is open to boys and girls entering grades 3-8 in the 2019-20 school year. It is our goal to give all our players a positive basketball experience. Good sportsmanship, as well as good attitude, will be emphasized so that all our athletes will be better people as well. Basketball will be taught, coached, and played on a competitive basis. Focus

The focus is on developing the offensive skills of the campers. Proper footwork, shooting technique, individual offensive moves, and ballhandling will be stressed each session.
